<a href="#"><u>HB 1005</u></a> <b>Agency rule-making authority</b> Creating accountability in agency rule-making authority. Prohibits rule making by state agencies except in certain specified instances.	H State Govt.	Taylor		
<a href="#"><u>HB 1026</u></a> <b>WA health security trust</b> Requiring the submission of a waiver to the federal government to create the Washington health security trust. Creates the Washington health security trust to provide coverage for a set of health services for all residents. Requires the joint select committee on health care oversight to contract for an actuarial analysis of the funding needs of the Washington health security trust and recommend a funding mechanism to the appropriate legislative standing committees and the governor. Directs the legislature to enact legislation implementing the recommendations of the joint select committee during the 2018 regular legislative session. <a href="#"><u>HB 1031</u></a> <b>UAVs near marine species</b> Concerning the use of unmanned aerial systems near certain protected marine species. Prohibits an unmanned aerial system from approaching, in any manner, within two hundred yards as measured in any direction, including vertically, of a southern resident orca whale. <a href="#"><u>HB 1120</u></a>	<b>Regulatory fairness act</b> Concerning the regulatory fairness act. Provides that the regulatory fairness act does not apply to the adoption of a rule if an agency is able to demonstrate that the proposed rule does not affect small businesses. Requires a proposing agency to consider mitigation options if a proposed rule affects only small businesses. Requires the office of regulatory assistance to: (1) Act as the central entity to collaborate with and provide support to state agencies to assist agencies in meeting the requirements of the regulatory fairness act; (2) Conduct extemporaneous reviews of agency compliance with the regulatory fairness act; and (3) Solicit comments on the review from the agency and include those comments in a review report. Prohibits the Department of Licensing from keeping copies or records of applications to purchase pistols or copies or records of pistol transfers. Requires state agencies to submit a written report to the speaker and minority leader of the house of representatives, the majority and minority leaders of the senate, and the governor, providing a comprehensive, detailed description of every agreement between the agency and the federal government.

Modifies certain duties of the joint administrative rules review committee with regard to approving a rule for adoption and introducing a bill to refer a suspended rule to the appropriate legislative committees. 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**REAL ID compliance** S Transportation King  
Facilitating compliance with the federal REAL ID act by modifying driver's license and identicaid design and fees.

Requires the department of licensing to mark a driver's license or identicaid issued under chapter 46.20 RCW, in accordance with the requirements of 6 C.F.R. Sec. 37.71, except for those issued under RCW 46.20.202 (licenses and identicards issued for Canadian border crossing).

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**Snohomish benchmark rate** S Health Care Pearson  
Concerning determination of the benchmark rate in Snohomish county for certain community residential services.

Requires the department of social and health services to use the King county classification for the purposes of determining the benchmark rate in Snohomish county for supported living services, group homes, group training homes, or licensed staffed residential homes.

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**Electronic legal material** S Law & Justice Pedersen  
Adopting the uniform electronic legal material act.  
[SB 5039](#)  
Establishes the uniform electronic legal material act.

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**Jnt. admin rules review comm** S State Govt. Dansel  
Concerning proceedings of the joint administrative rules review committee.  
[SB 5055](#)  
Provides that upon filing of a petition for review with the joint administrative rules review committee and service of the petition upon the agency, all promulgation, implementation, enforcement, and amendment of the proposed or existing rule, policy, interpretive statement, guideline, or document is stayed pending final conclusion of the rules review process.

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**Government performance** S State Govt. Miloscia  
Concerning government performance and accountability.  
[SB 5065](#)  
Establishes the performance management act. Creates the office of performance management, in the office of the governor, which should: (1) Be granted administrative authority over state performance management programs, ensuring that all executive branch agencies properly implement world-class lean performance management systems to achieve operational excellence; and (2) Coordinate performance assessments of state agencies by independent examiners. Requires the department of enterprise services to enter into a partnership with the national institutes of standards and technology, United States department of commerce, and performance excellence northwest and Washington state quality award to develop a suite of web-based classroom training modules for employees, middle managers, supervisors, and senior agency leaders.

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**Zero-based budget reviews** S State Govt. Miloscia

Concerning state budgeting through zero-based budget reviews.

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Establishes the zero-based budget review process to provide more thorough analysis of the programs and services provided by state agencies and to better prioritize the expenditure of public resources.
