Public Safety Wireless

What did we do?

- Listening Sessions through April 2019
- Over 35 attendees
- Attendees included law enforcement, fire, 911 centers, cities and counties, Tribal, DFW, WSDOT, among others.
- Public Safety Survey
- Over 70 responses





Public Safety Wireless

What did we learn?

Washington Public Safety Wireless Expectation	
Coverage	We expect to receive accurate wireless coverage that is tracked and validated regardless of the wireless provider.
Mobile Data Downloads	We expect fast, reliable, and accurate network speed for data downloads, video, maps, situational awareness, etc.
Access to Public Safety Wireless Services	We expect only authorized public safety users will have access to public safety priority and pre-emption wireless services. We expect a documented process for vetting and credentialing potential users to ensure only authorized users have access. We expect cooperation with the state of Washington to identify appropriate authorized users of public safety wireless services.
Network Performance	We expect to have access to real time network performance or receive regular network performance status updates. We expect wireless provider networks to meet CJIS compliance standards.
Unlimited Wireless Plans	We expect truly unlimited plans with no throttling in a public safety emergency or event.
Wireless Interoperability	We expect seamless interoperability for first responders regardless of communication type, cell phone, radio, satellite phone, or wireless provider.
Emergency Coordination	We expect Washington State Emergency Management (EMD) to be notified of network outages lasting more than 2 hours and coordination with EMD to include the deployment of communication equipment during a large-scale emergency.
