

Workers' Compensation Systems Modernization

Project Overview

The Workers' Compensation Systems Modernization (WCSM) project aims to replace L&I's "legacy" workers' compensation computer systems and its cumbersome business processes with a modern technical solution(s). This will help streamline and automate manual processes, which will lead to additional efficiencies and even better return-to-work outcomes for injured workers.

Critical Risks and Issues

Risk: Project director position is vacant.

Mitigation:

- The project director role has been open since February after the previous director left unexpectedly.
- We're working with an external firm to find a replacement and have begun interviewing four candidates they recommended. Our goal is to have a new project director by this fall to ensure a smooth transition.

Risk: Misalignment of project governance.

Mitigation:

- The governance structure, approved by the executive steering committee in 2022, was reviewed this summer, and the team took additional training to ensure compliance.
- A RAPID matrix for decision-making and communication was implemented in August to help keep everything aligned.

Risk: Insufficient time for critical project documentation.

Mitigation:

- The project team is using an iterative approach to tackle this issue.
- We've already completed the second draft of the project charter, scheduled one-on-one meetings with subject matter experts in August to discuss risks, issues, and assumptions, and identified resources for the decision package.
- The modernization approach is on hold until further steps are decided, but we aim to complete everything on time.
